## Special guest star... you!



"Showing-up in your presentations is the next best thing to being there."

The **Cameo** feature in PowerPoint allows presenters with a webcam to embed a live camera feed into any slide and directly insert themselves into the deck.

This allows presenters to visually interact with data and other slide content. Plus, it offers a more immersive experience for all participants and works seamlessly with PowerPoint Live too.



How-to: Start by first turning on your webcam, then going to Insert > Cameo. Select the Preview icon if your camera's feed is not showing.



Next, use the **Camera Format** tab to move, resize, add borders, transitions, and even animations to your **Cameo** object to integrate it to your liking.









Lastly, select **Slide Show** (found in the Ribbon) to present using **Cameo**, or you can use it to present directly in a Teams meeting with PowerPoint Live. Voilà!



**Note:** PowerPoint's Cameo shouldn't be confused with the celebrity shout-out site of the same name. Although, imagine Vanilla Ice giving his thoughts on third-quarter earnings. *Nice, nice, baby!* 





#### Be more inclusive.



"Ensure differently-abled colleagues receive your message."

You want your message to resonate with every single member of your audience, including ones with visual, auditory, motor, and/or cognitive disabilities.


There are things you can do to create a fully-accessible slide deck, like adding ScreenTips and providing alternative text with all images.

But what if you have a presentation ready that hasn't been created with these steps in mind?




While building your deck, you can consult the **Accessibility Checker** which provides reminders in the status bar.

How-to: In order to run the tool manually on an entire deck, go to the Review tab and click on Check Accessibility.



Not only will this tool highlight any potential issues under **Inspection Results**, but it will also suggest how to solve them.






Ideally, you should keep the checker running in the background while you work, so you can make accessibility updates to the deck in real-time.

Remember, accessibility is fundamentally about making sure people can access the content you create, so it's essential that any recipient of your slide deck can understand the information within it.





## Get in great shape.



"Morph transitions and create some subtle slide deck magic."


Grown tired of routine presentations that cycle from one slide to another with the same transitions? You can bet your audience is too.

You can add eye-grabbing production value by incorporating seamless movement between slides using the **Morph** transition feature without requiring individual motion paths or animations.



How-to: In the thumbnail pane on the left, select the slide you wish to transition to.

This should be the destination slide of the morphing transition (Slide 2; on the right). Next, navigate to the Transitions tab, and select Morph.




Select **Effect Options** and choose how you'd like the animation to work: focusing on the Objects, Words, or Characters you're applying the Morph to.



In this example, we've moved, resized, and changed the colour of the Objects from Slide 1 to Slide 2.





Slide 2

We then used Transitions > Preview to see the circles transforming on their own. Then, we and adjusted the speed of the morph by going to the Transitions > Timing tab, and changing the Duration (in seconds).

Experiment making your own interesting effects using different images and words, to see what's most attractive and effective for your deck.

TIP: You can't morph a marginal presentation into one that appears like you didn't create it while binging dating shows.


